3. The hall will be open from 9am on the day of the show for the reception of exhibits, which must be staged by 11am. **THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY APPLIED.** The hall will be closed to all but the committee at 11am prompt.

4. Exhibitors must stage articles for exhibition and competition. No vases or containers will be provided. The committee will not be responsible for loss or damage.

5. No exhibit may be removed before 4.15pm. The Prize Giving will commence at 4pm.

6. Exhibitors may only exhibit one entry in any one class.

7. Points – All classes in Sections A, B and C will be awarded as follows: 1st: 5 points, 2nd: 3 points, 3rd: 1 point.

8. The committee will appoint competent judges, whose decision shall in all cases be final.

9. Each exhibit entry – 15p except for Section D and Children’s Section, both of which will be free.

Odd late entries will be charged at 20p.






THE SWALCLIFFE CONCERTS – THE SAVAGE PRUNES


