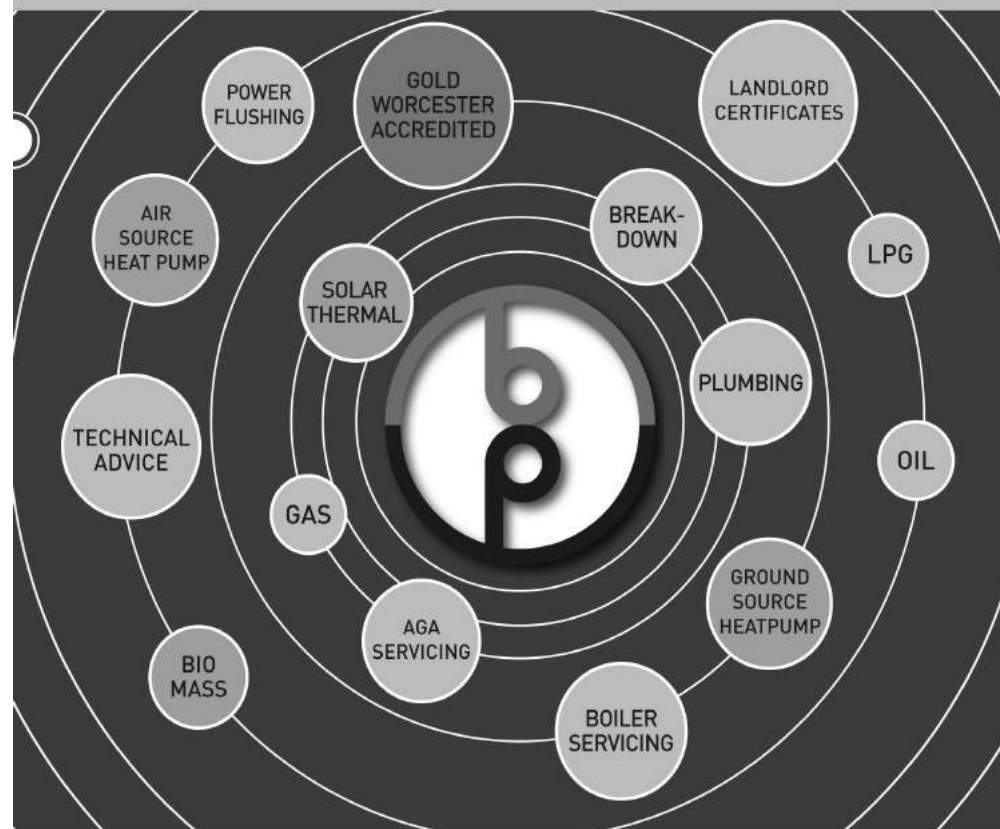

Our new Reception children have made a smooth transition into Acorn Class, with personalised care and support from our own Miss Blake and Mrs Higley. The buzz in their classroom is a little louder at times, but still very purposeful and they are having a lovely time!

The weather seemed to become Autumnal almost overnight this year, which has meant a wonderful contrast in sights, sounds and smells in Forest School between our current sessions and those of the summer term. Children have been out and about experiencing the joys of outdoor learning with our trained Forest School Leaders since the first week back, and they tell me they are having "the best fun"!

Oak Class ventured down to the Orchard to pick the fruit from the trees – a lovely selection of apples, pears and plums - and have been 'selling' this at the end of the school day to collect contributions for our friends at the Rojo Rojo Aids orphanage in Kenya. All sorts of exciting things are planned for the term ahead, as well as some great after school clubs; Science Club, Brain Games, Spanish Drama, Musical Theatre, Football & Netball. This is an impressive range for a small, village school.

The World Triathlon AG Championships at Rotterdam was my last big race of the season.

Even though I had qualified for both the Sprint and Standard distance at this event, I choose to go the longer distance (Standard), 1.5km swim, 40km bike and 10km run.

It was a very technical and challenging bike course with a lot of dead turns but I actually preferred this to an out and back straight course.

The weather was cold but dry and an early race start at 7.44 am meant setting up for the race was all done in the dark, a first for me, also a very early breakfast!

I had a good swim, albeit a little chilly and I was slightly hampered by the rising sun reflecting on the water, which made sighting difficult.

I had a good bike ride, my fastest time yet and began the run leg in 5th position. I felt strong for the run and soon overtook the two Australian girls in front of me putting me in third position and subsequently the bronze medal.

It was my fourth ever standard distance race and I was very pleased to find out that I had taken 7 minutes off my previous best race time.

As always, a massive thank you to all my local community support, family and friends, some of who came to watch the race, which was lovely to have them to celebrate with me at the finish line.

Now time to go back to University and start a winter of hard training.

Suffice to say Tom had a fantastic time on the combine; it definitely was the highlight of his summer. He doesn't understand how poignant the day was for the rest of us or understand that his 'Grampy Tractors' ashes were scattered there, he just had an amazing time on the combine.

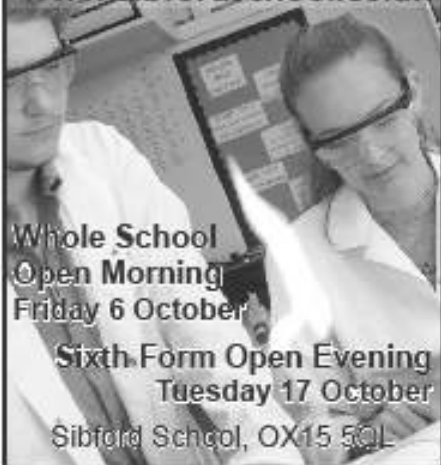

FixMyStreet is an independent website, built by the charity *mySociety*, who wanted to make it easier to report problems in your community, even if you don't know who those reports should go to.

So they made FixMyStreet. All you have to do is type in a postcode – or let the site locate you automatically – and describe your problem. They then send your report to the people whose job it is to fix it.


FixMyStreet covers the whole of the UK. No matter where you are, the only thing you ever have to remember is the web address – FixMyStreet.com.

Do councils read or act on FixMyStreet reports?

They certainly do. Reports sent through FixMyStreet go into the same council email inboxes as reports sent through by any other means.

Really smart councils *integrate directly*, and can place report details directly into their systems, saving them time and money.
