

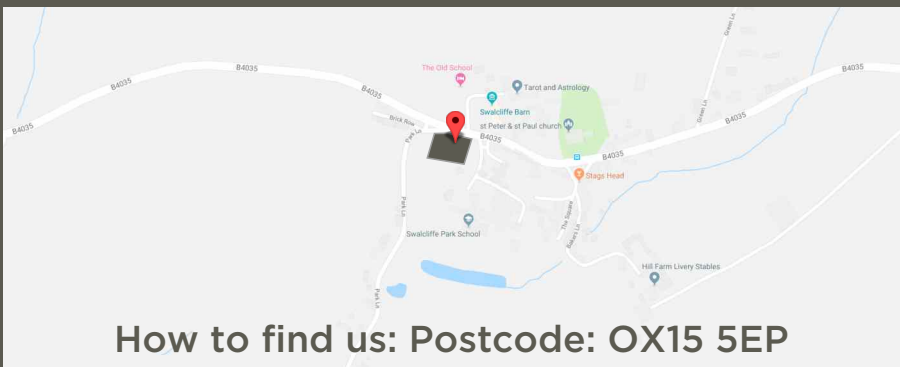


Located right in the heart of the North Oxfordshire village of Swalcliffe, the new Woodland Play Park is a community-driven project that provides a unique facility for young children in the local area. They can play, explore, learn and enjoy the rich biodiversity of a small, native English woodland in a safe and secure setting.

It is more than a play area; it is designed to arouse curiosity in the natural woodland environment and encourage kids to explore, to find evidence of the fascinating wildlife that is there all around them.

- A circular trail for kids to run free

- Safe and sturdy wooden swings and slide
- Wooden stepping stones
- Bird and bat boxes, bug hotels
- Sensory garden with native English herbs and flowers
- Nature notes on accessible signs to encourage children to look up, look around, look down and look under stones and fallen leaves
- Accessibility for pushchairs and wheelchairs.
