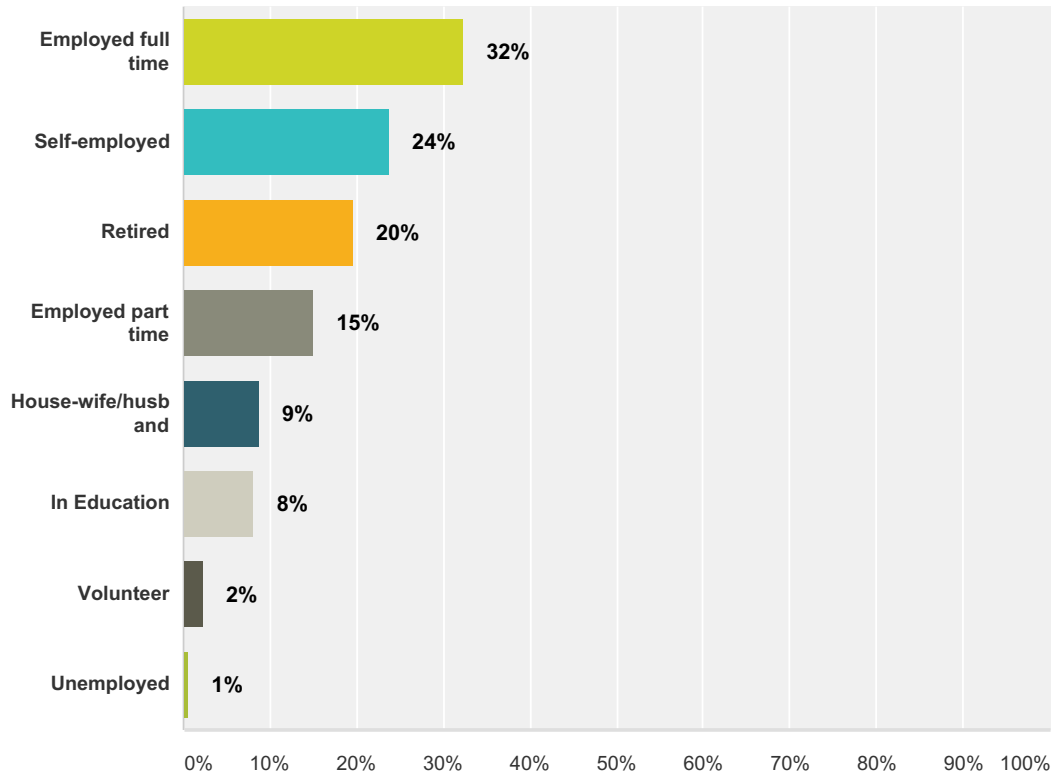

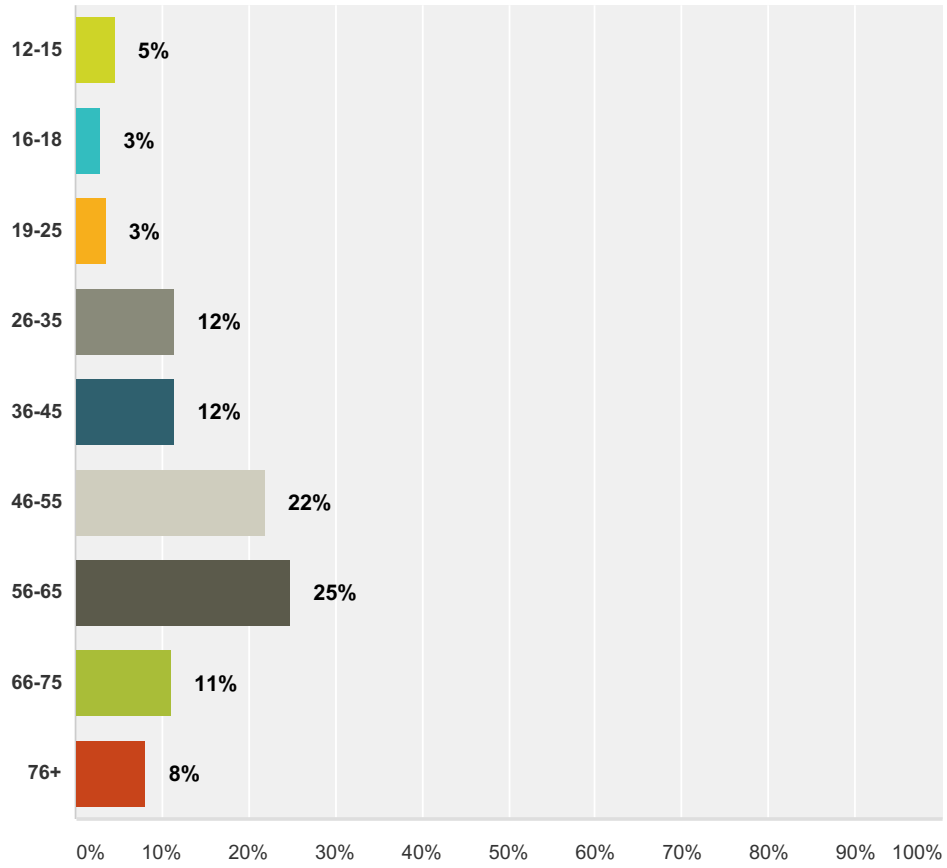

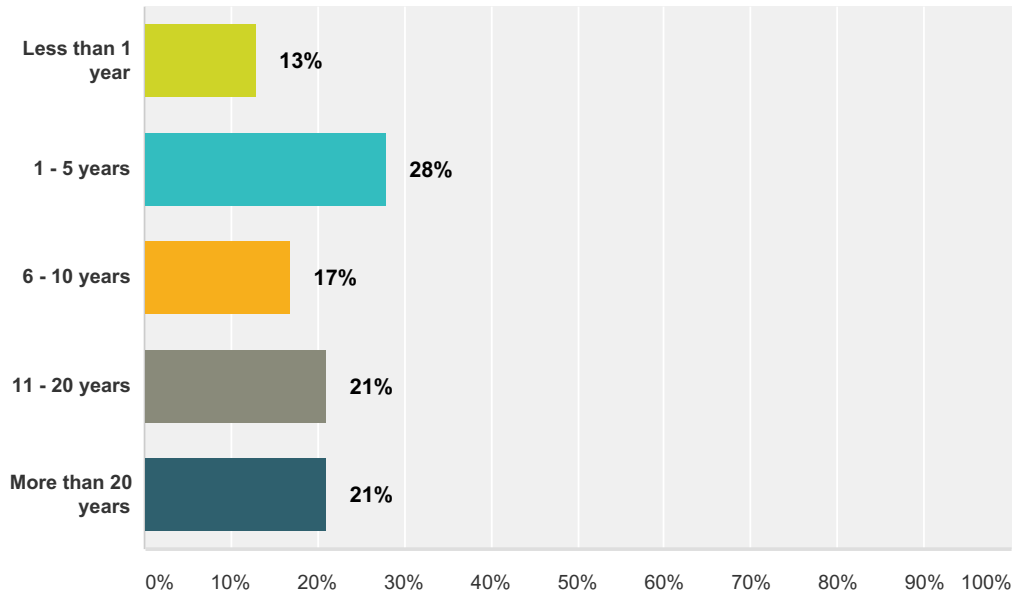

Q5 A5. How long have you lived in Swalcliffe?

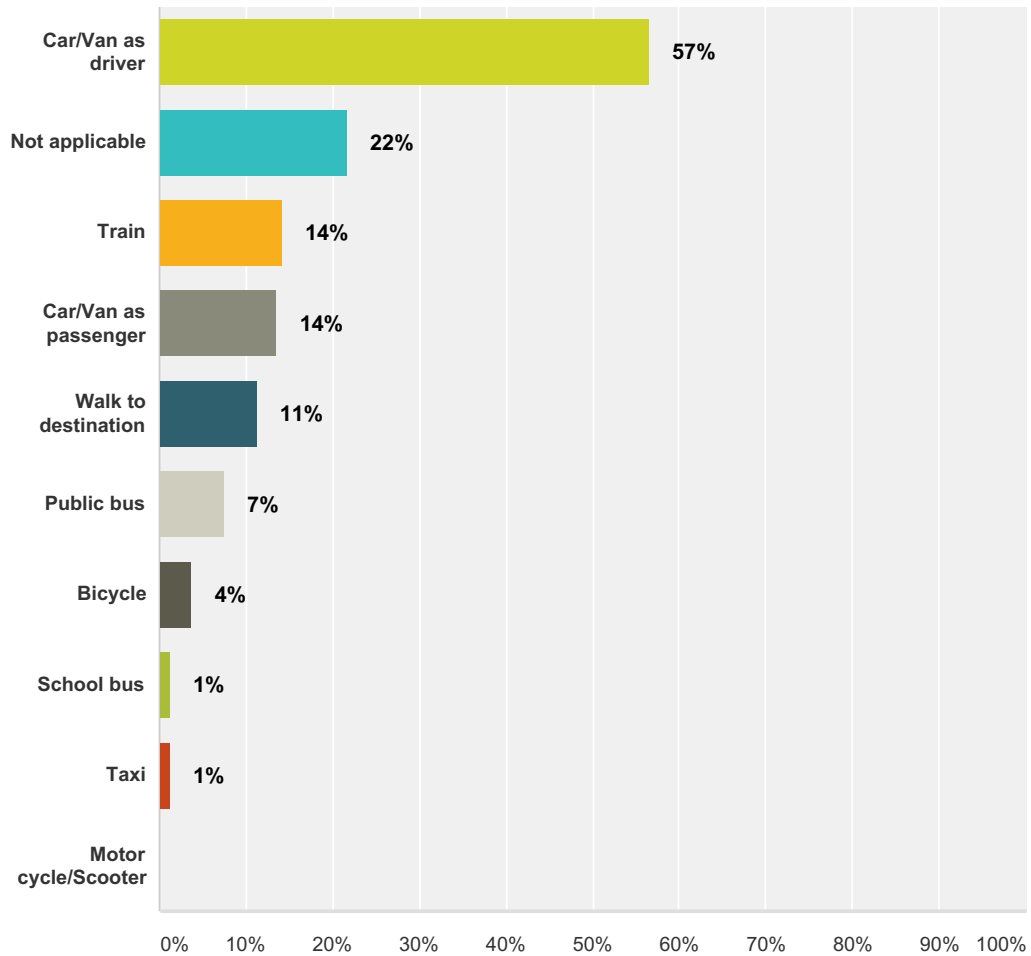

Q6 B1. If you travel to work, school, or college, what types of transport do you use? (Please tick all that apply)

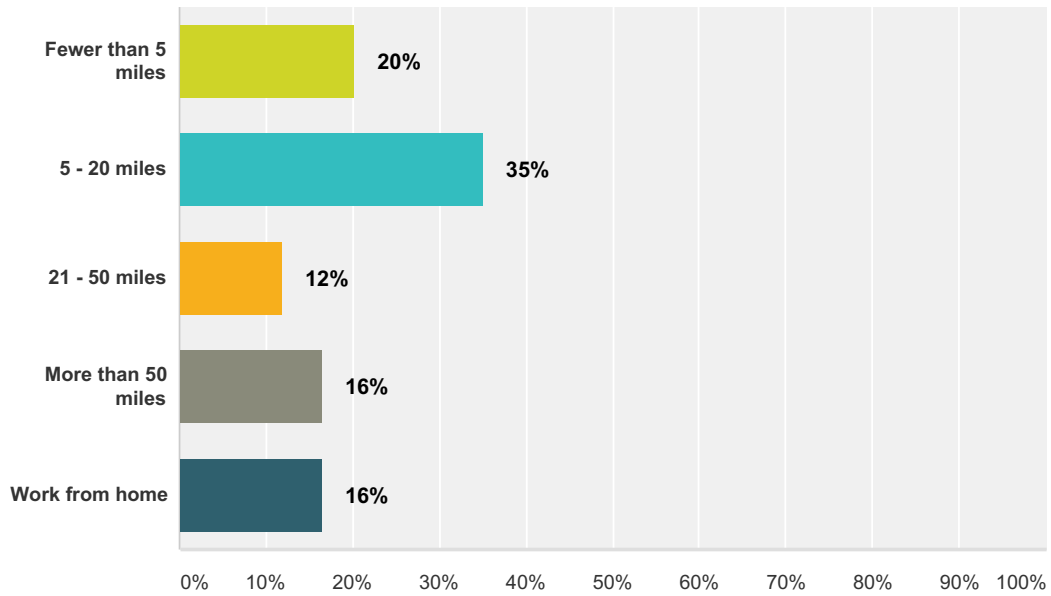

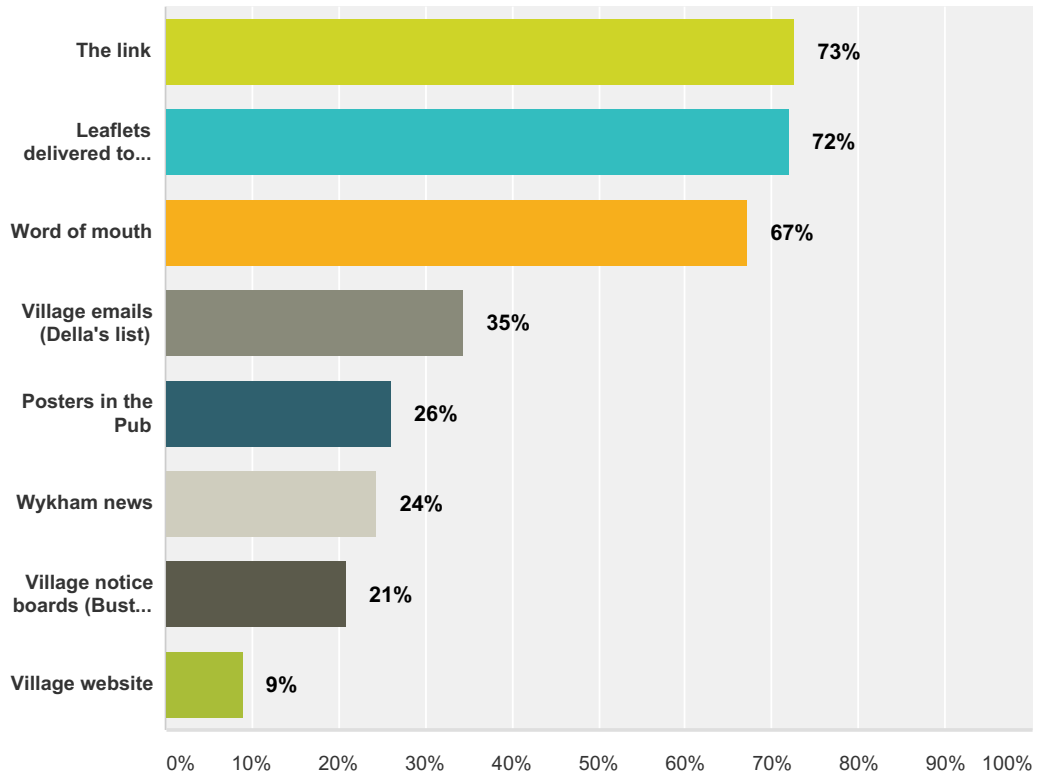

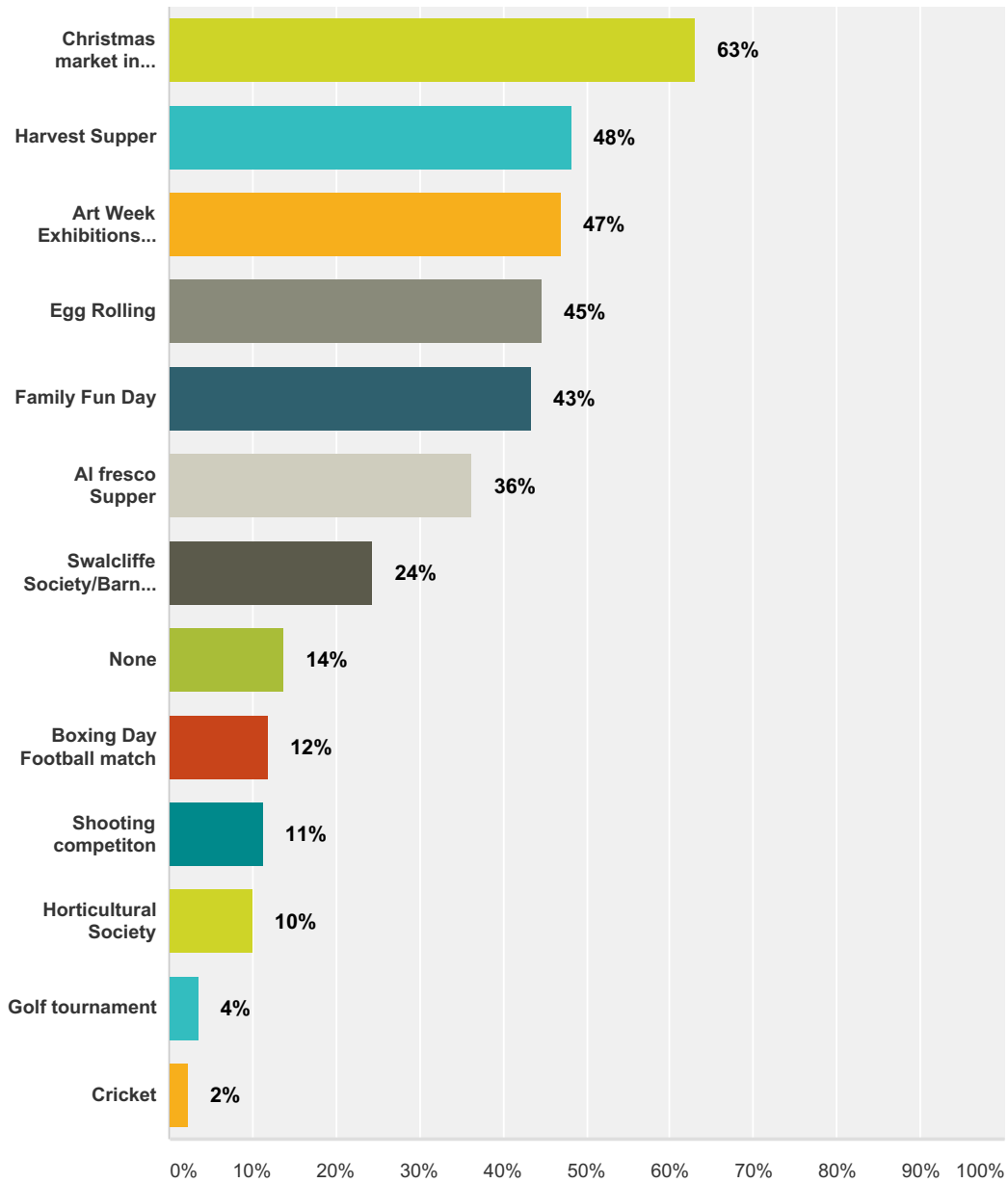

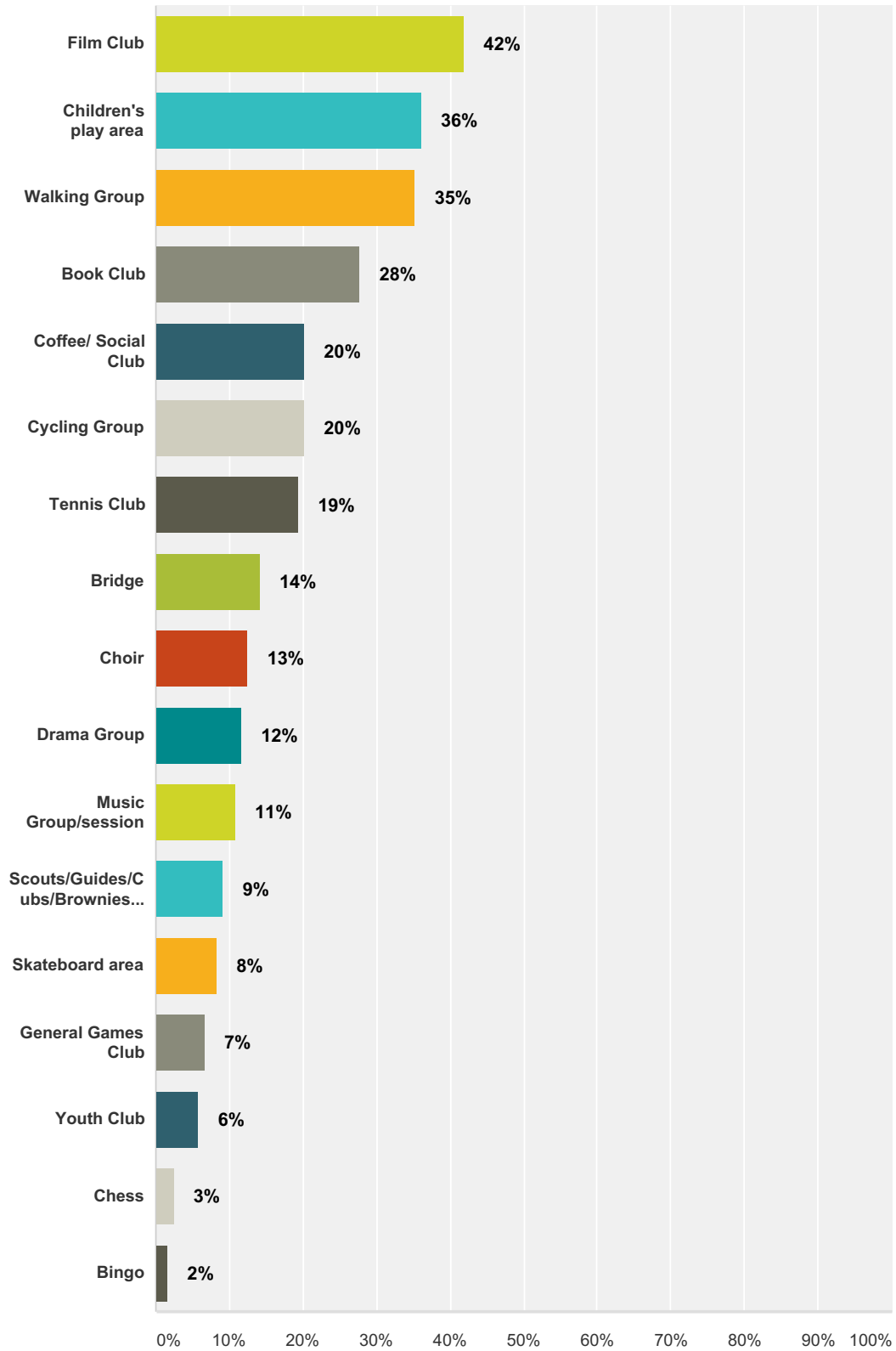

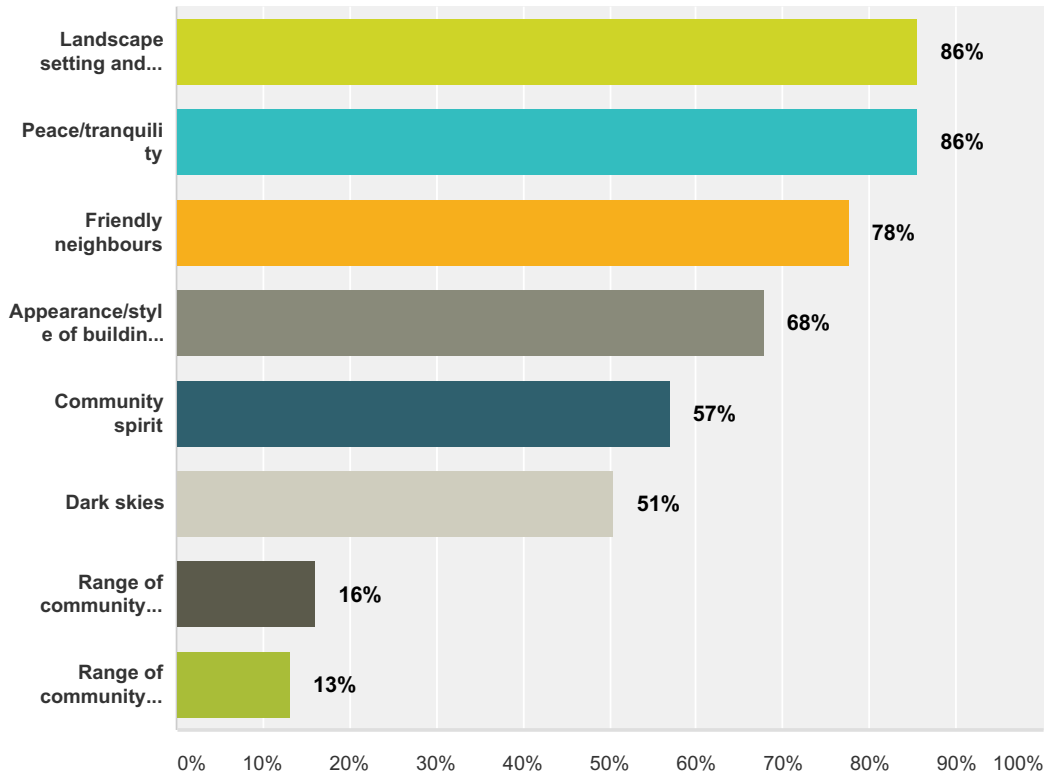

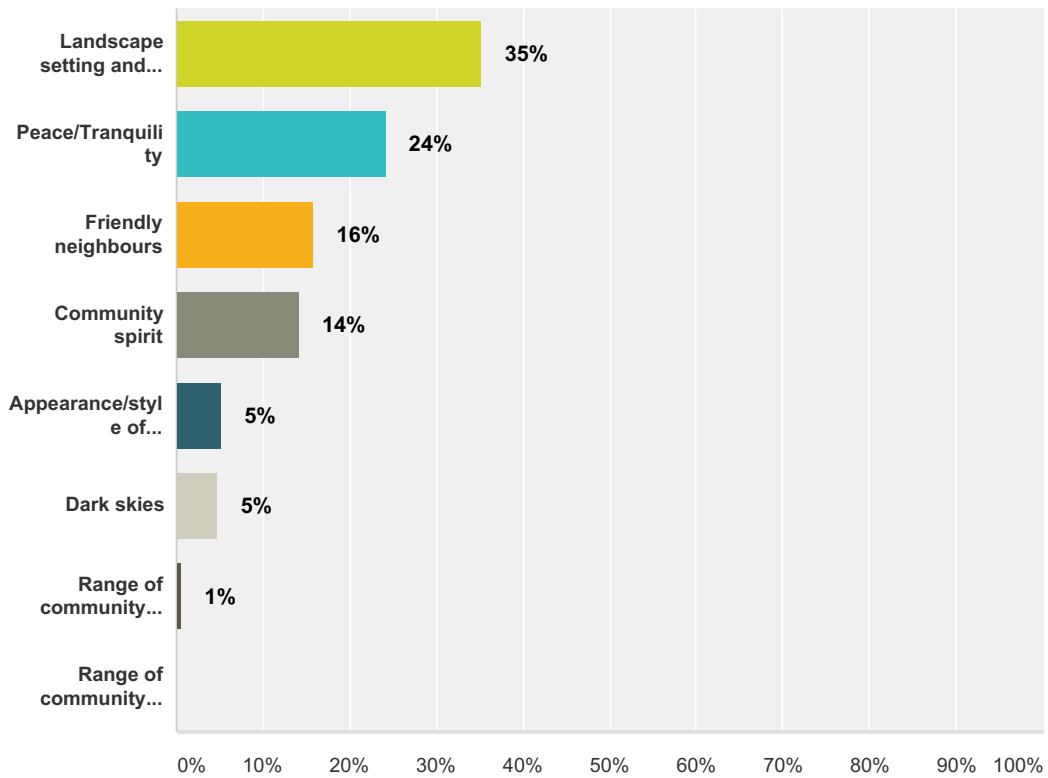

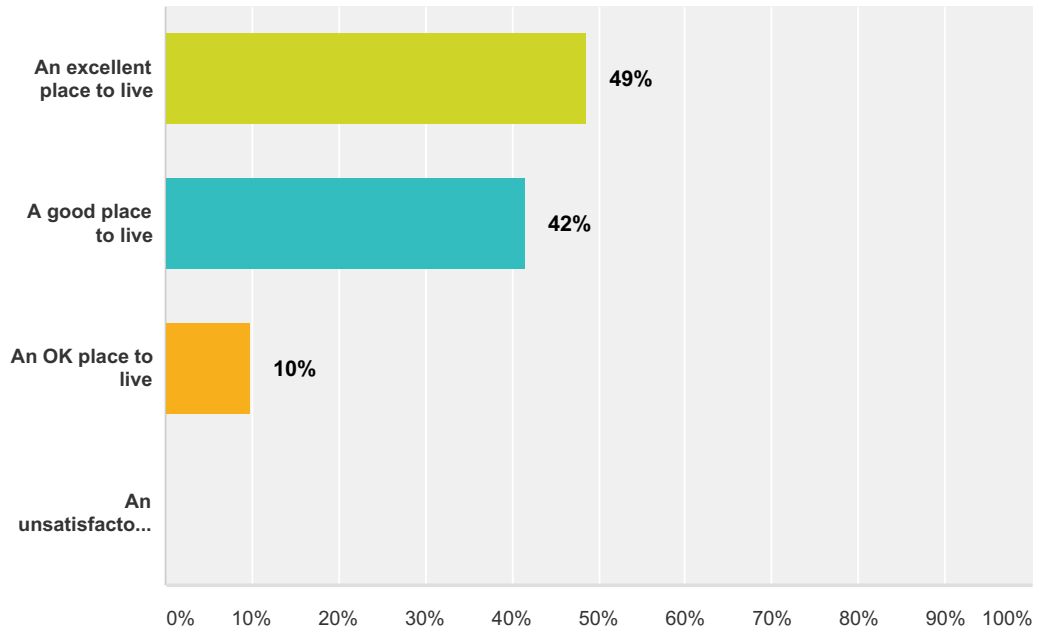

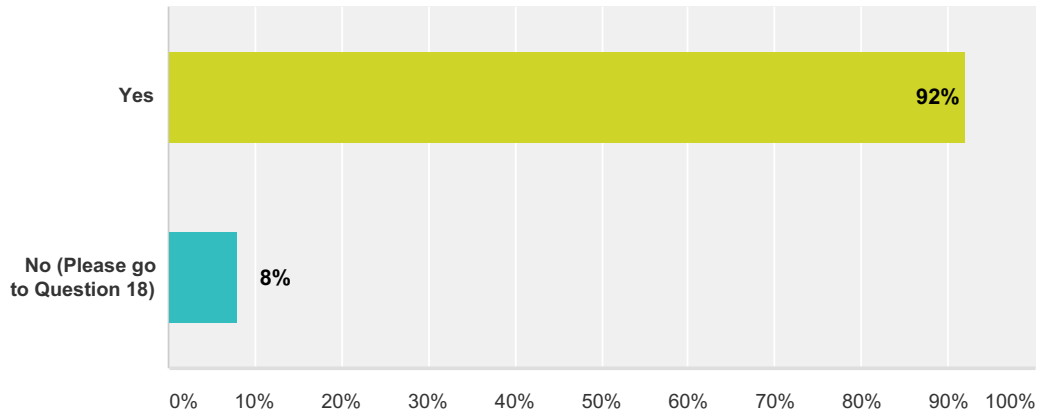

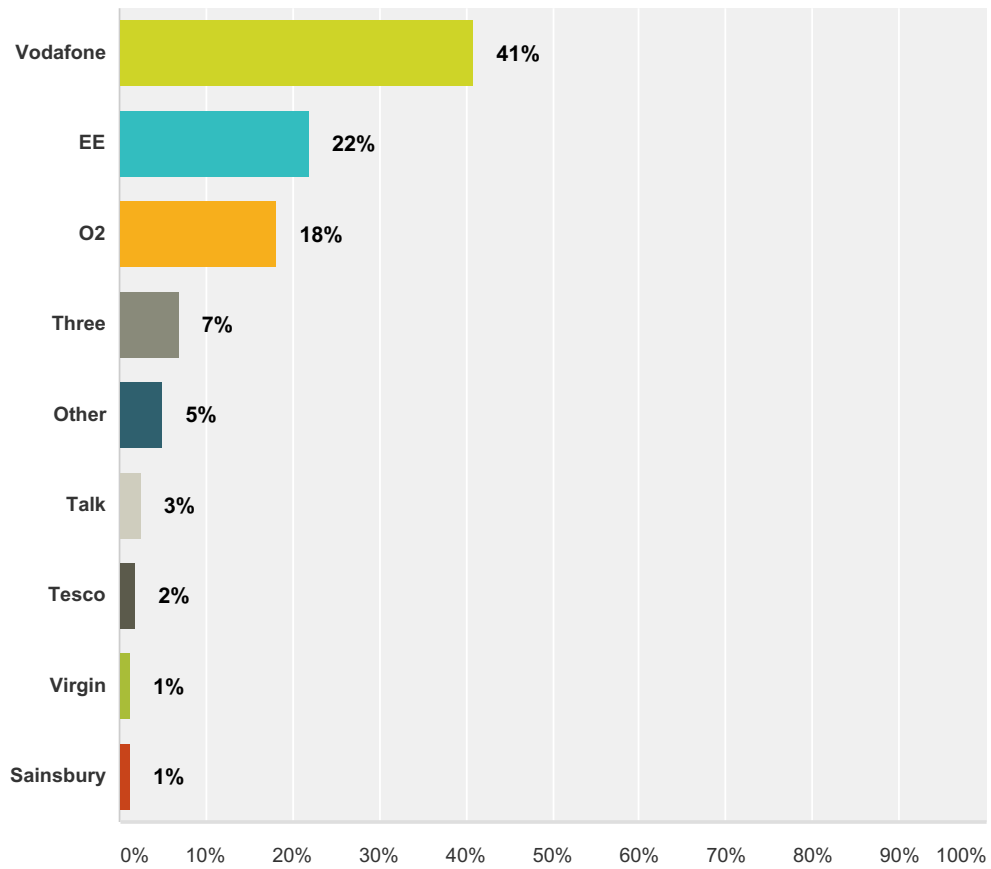

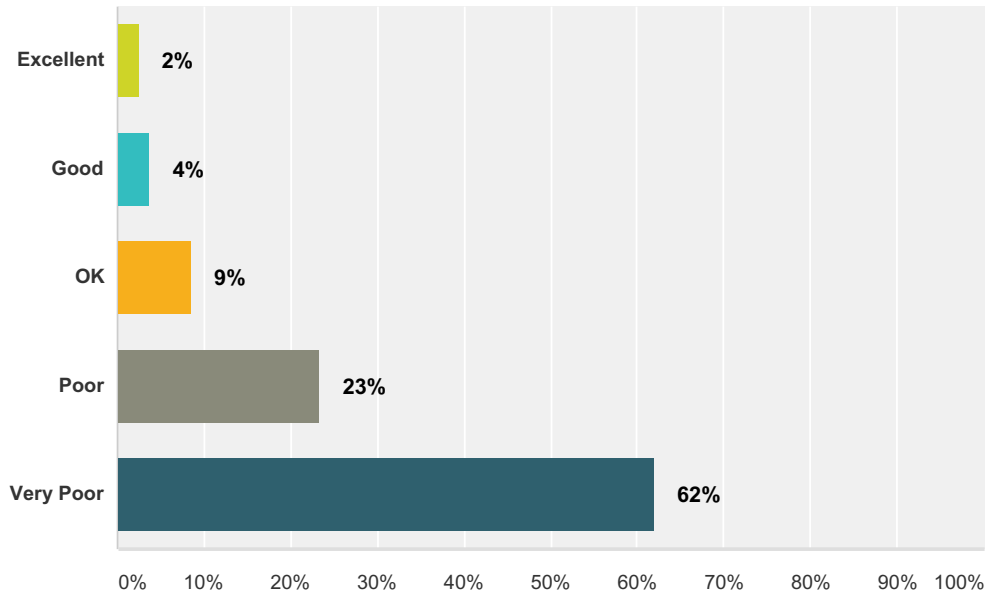

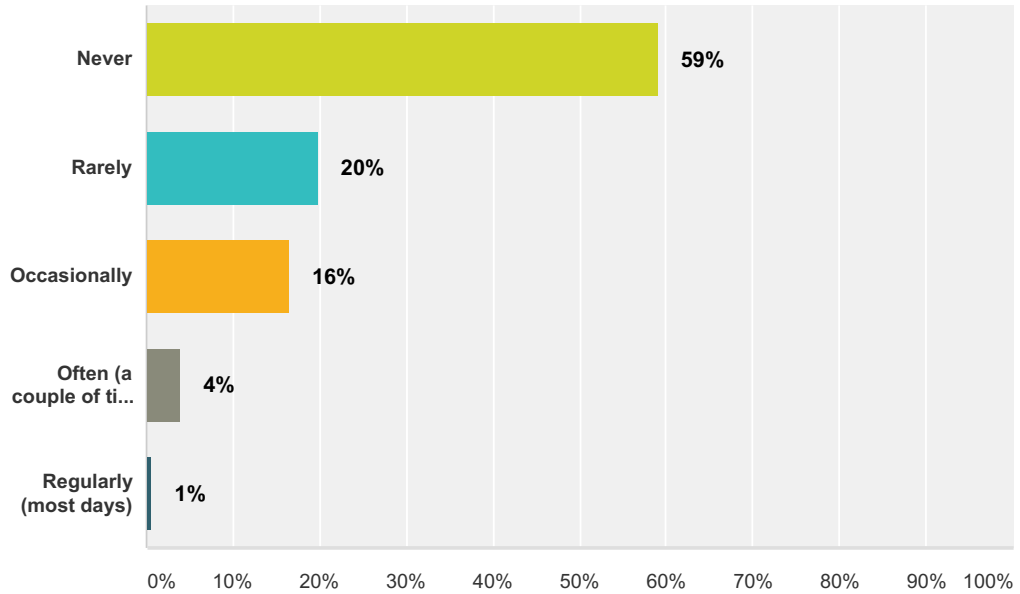

How often do you use the bus? (Please tick one)**

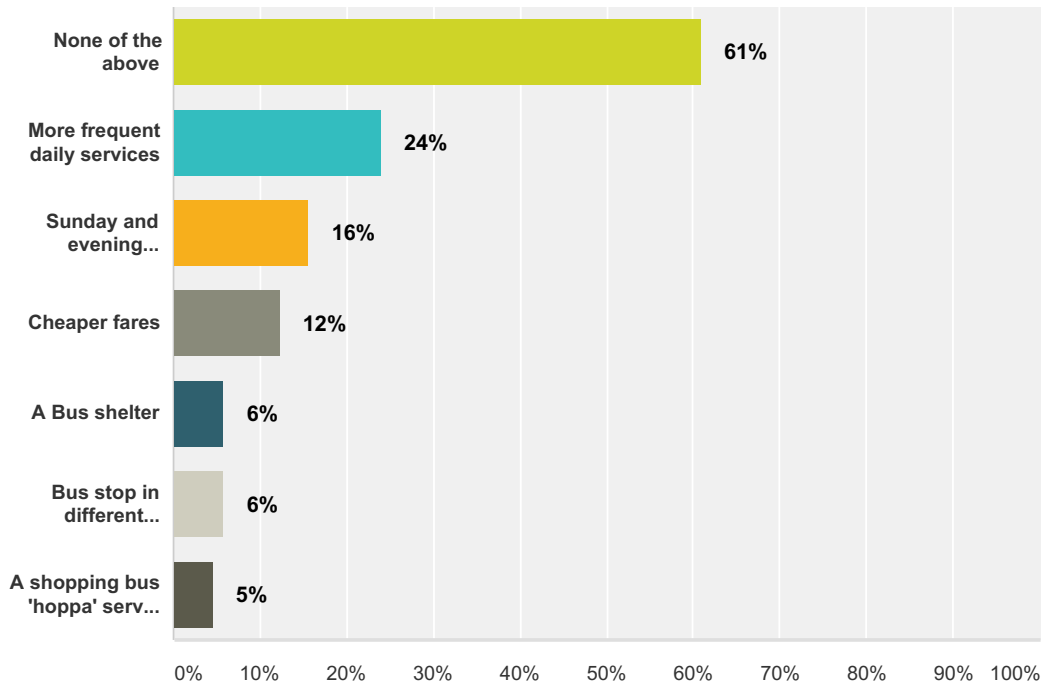

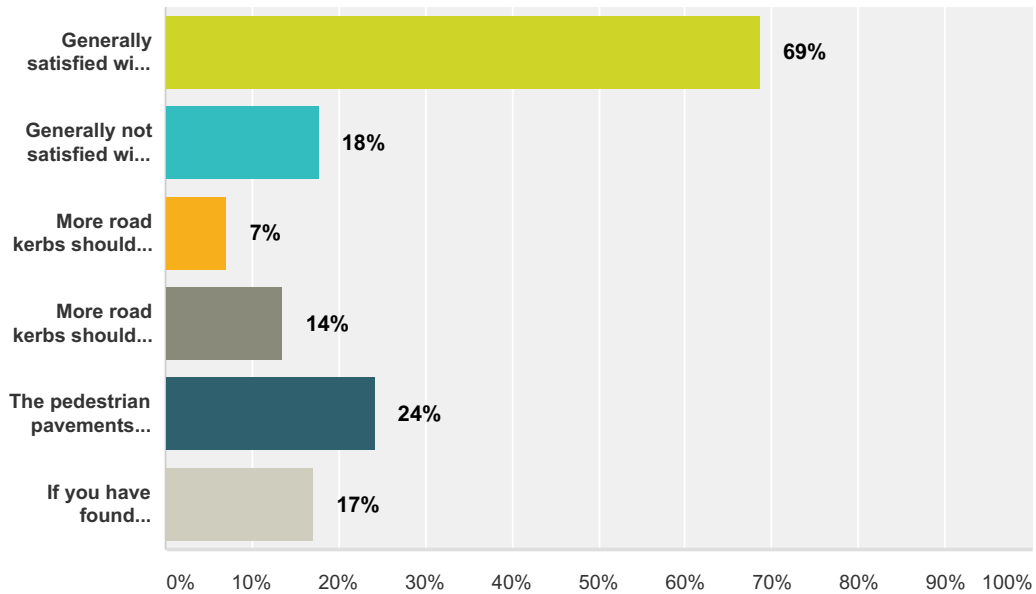

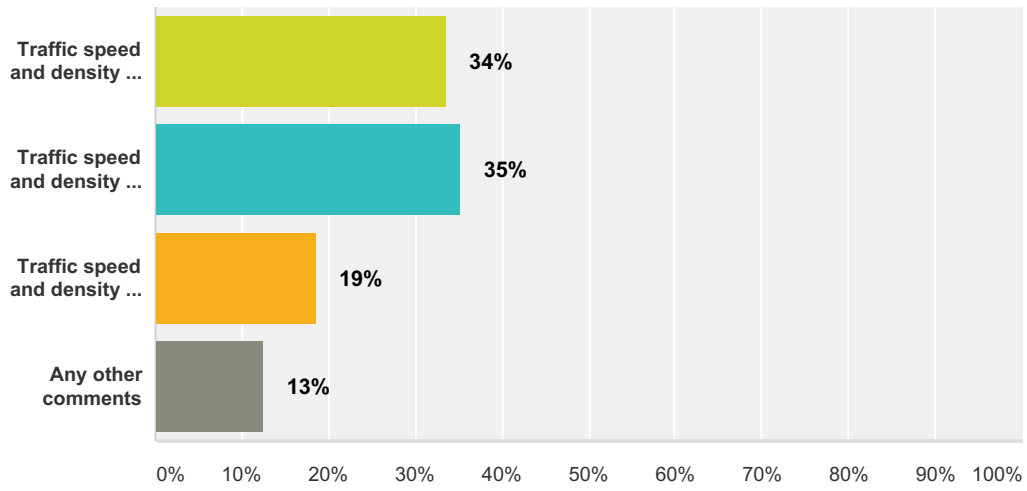

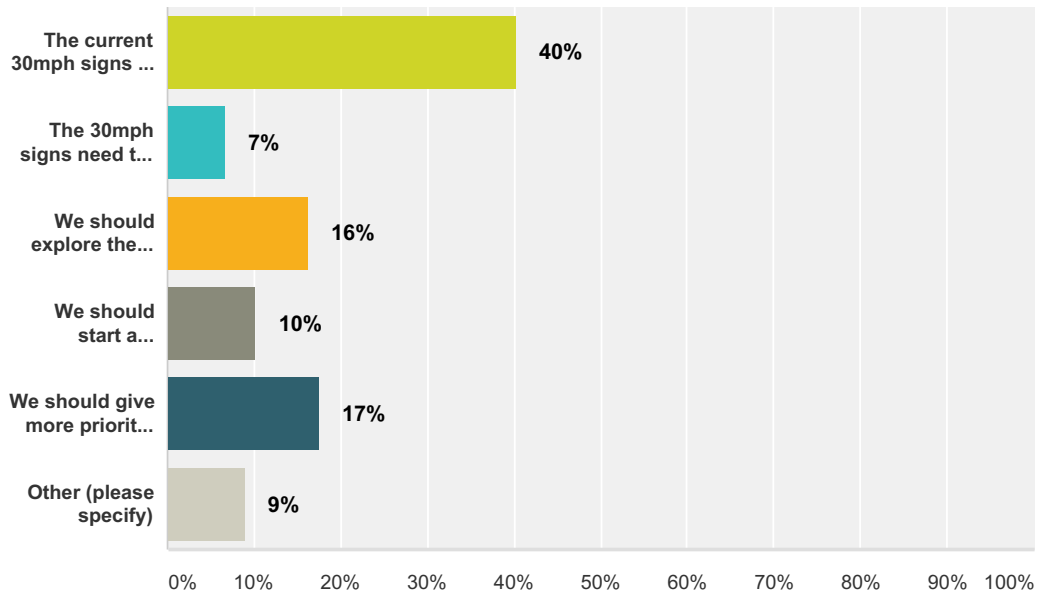

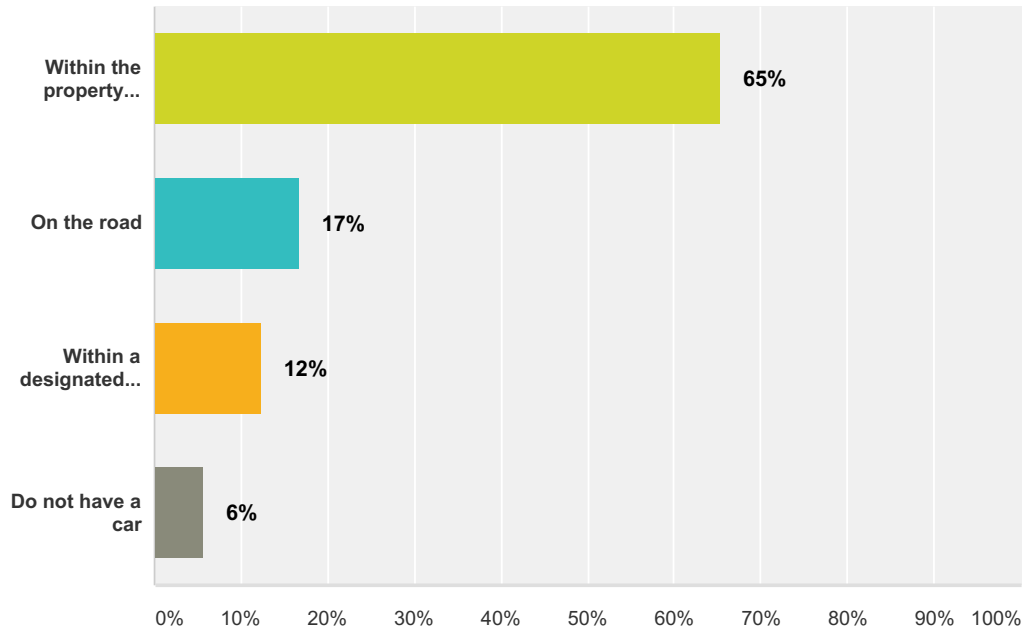

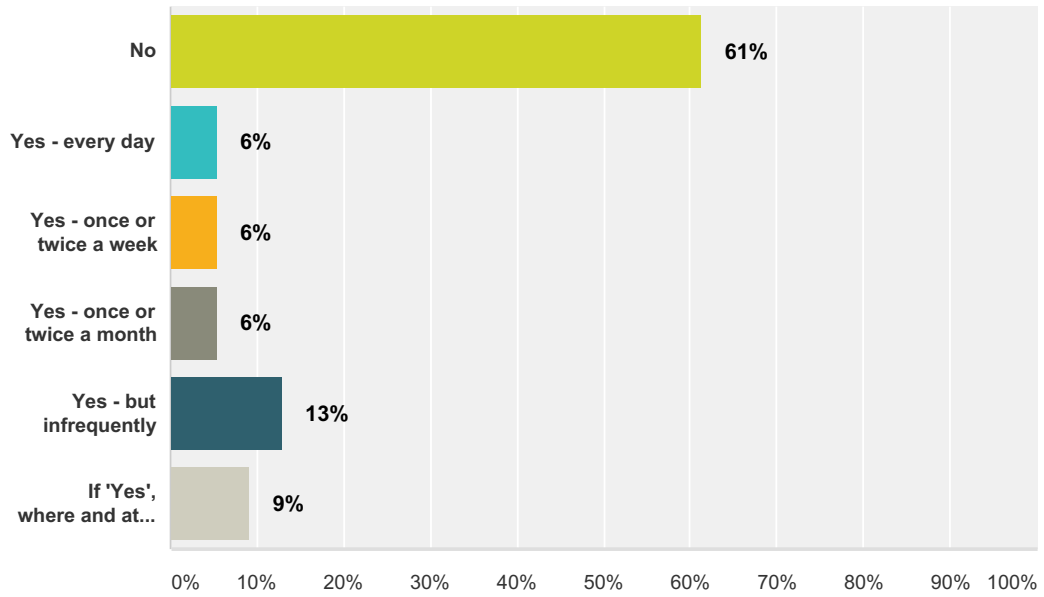

Q24 C.11 Parking on road: Is parking a problem for you and your visitors?

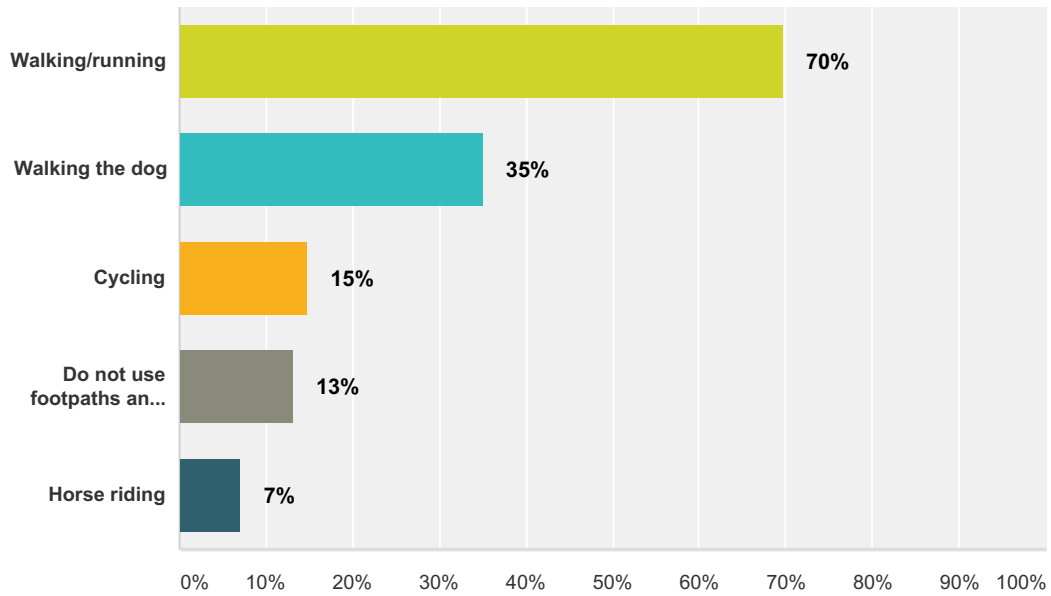

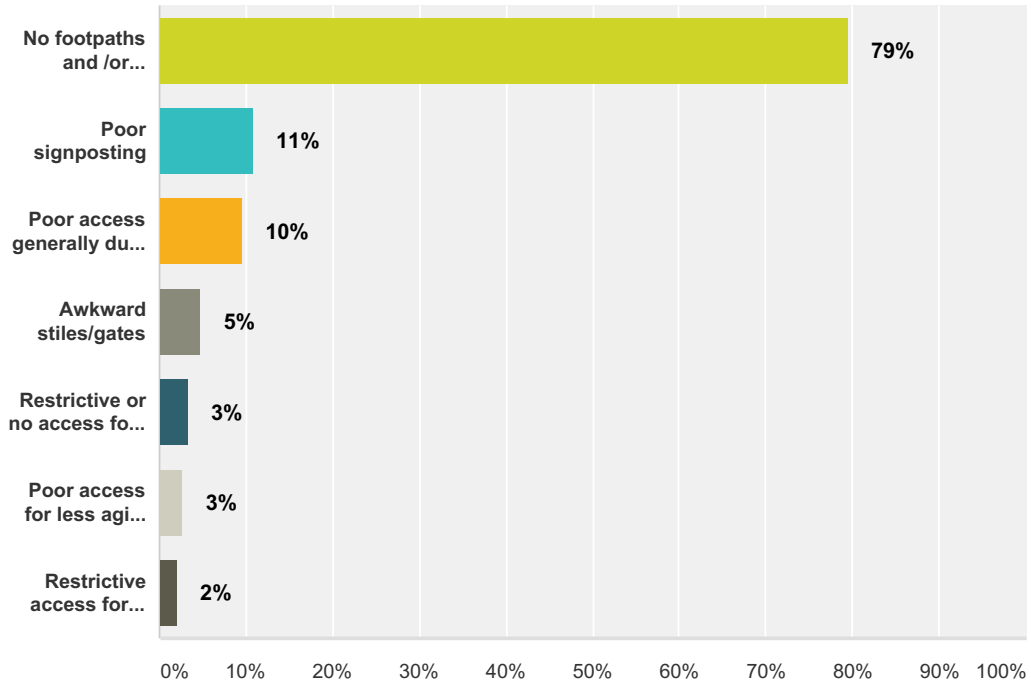

Q26 C13. Footpaths/bridleways. Do any footpaths or bridleways present a problem for access and ease of use? (Please tick all that apply)

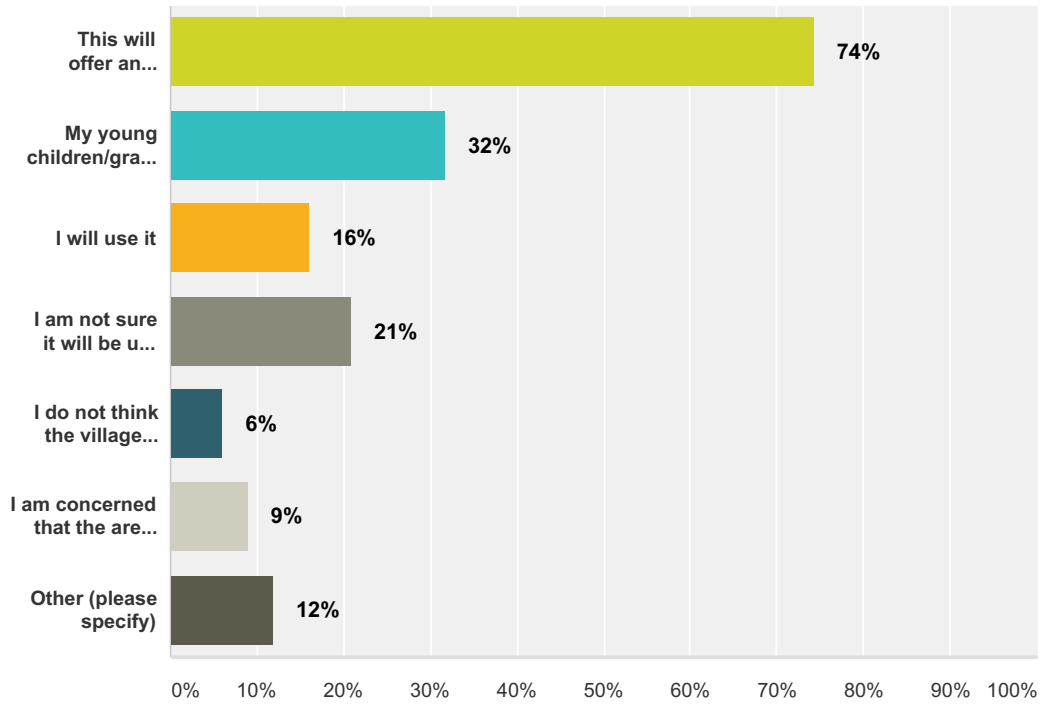

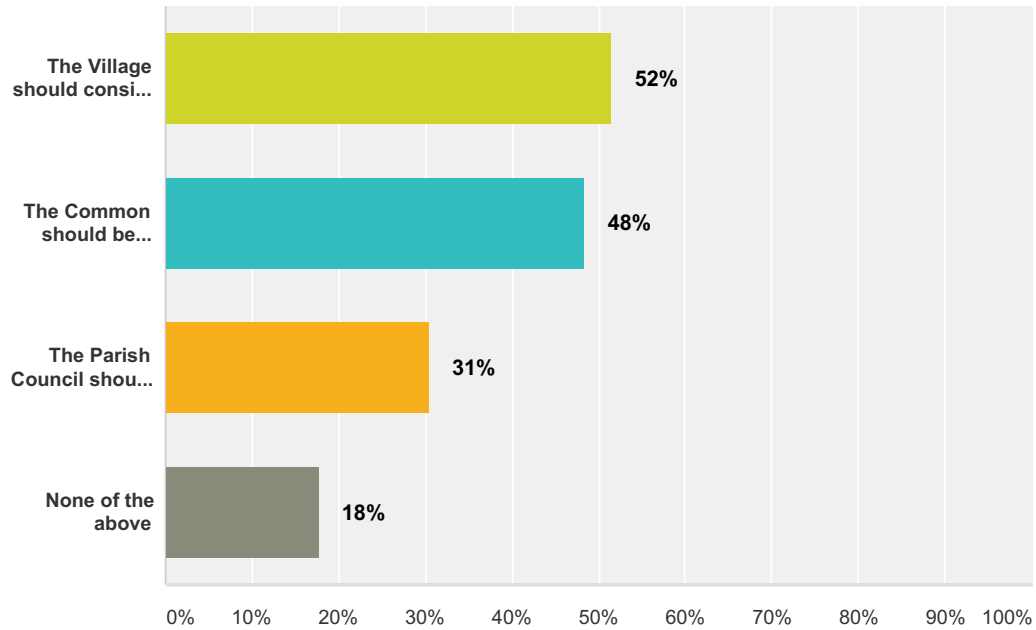

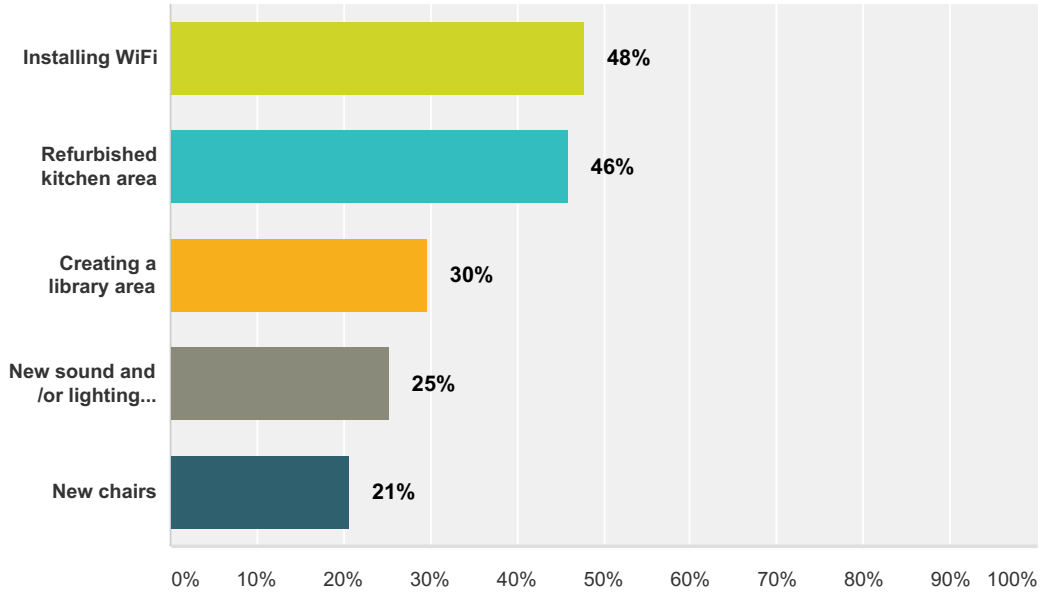

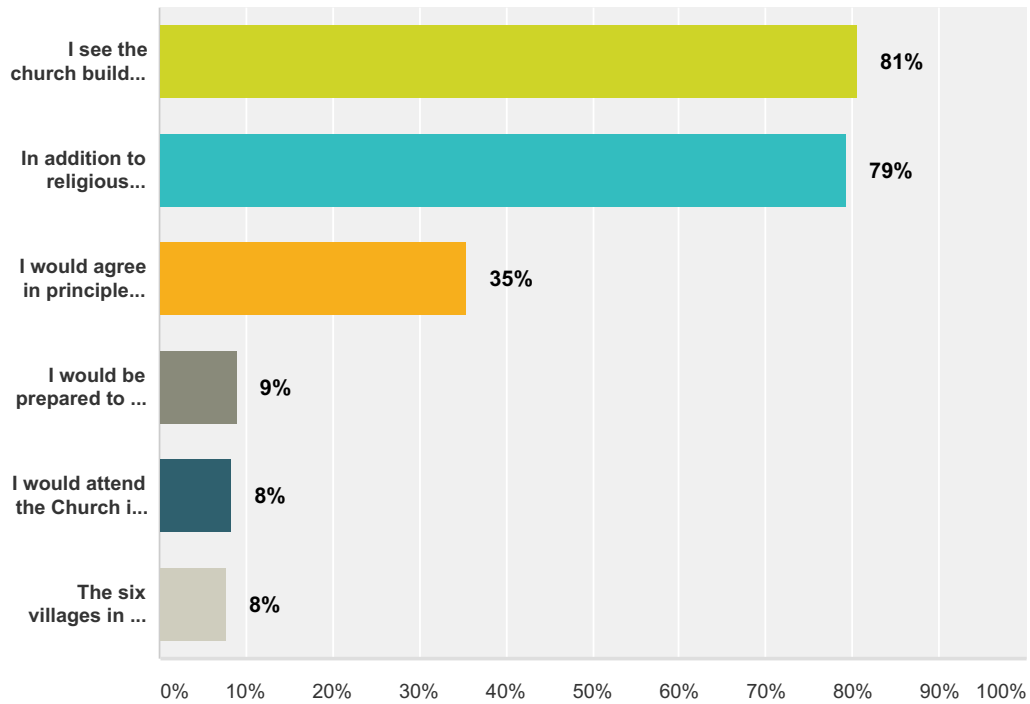

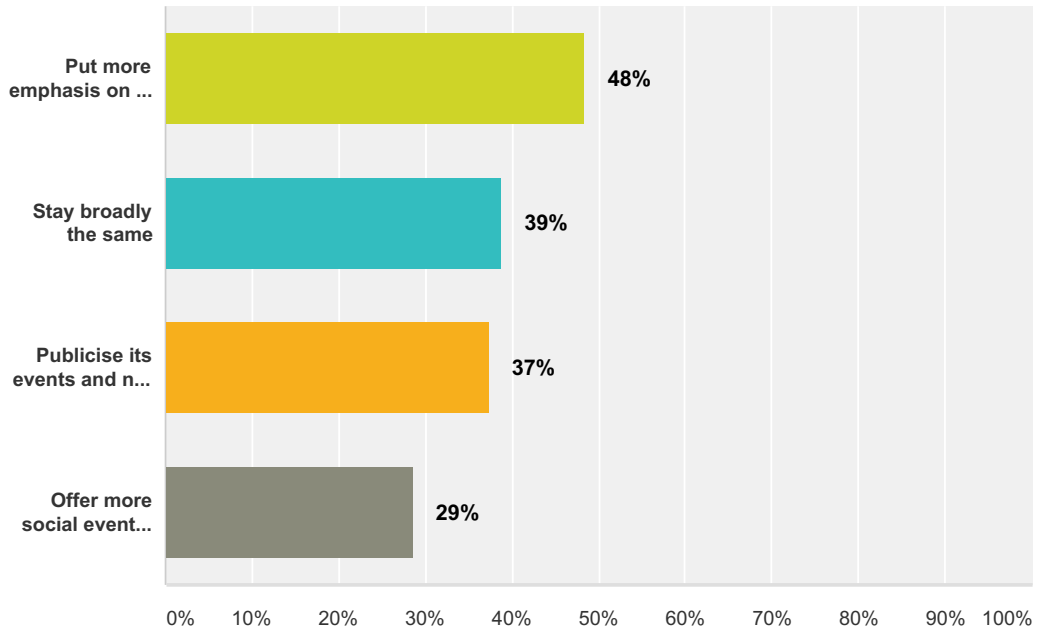

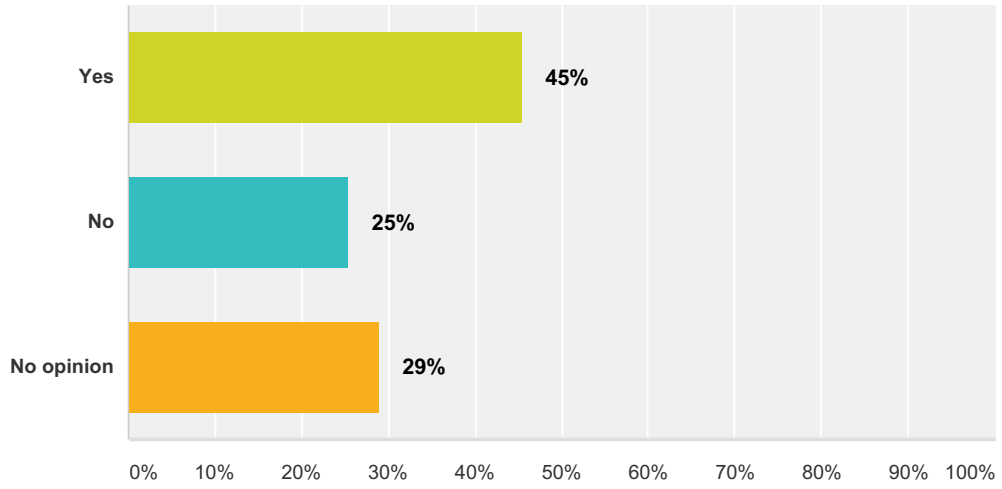

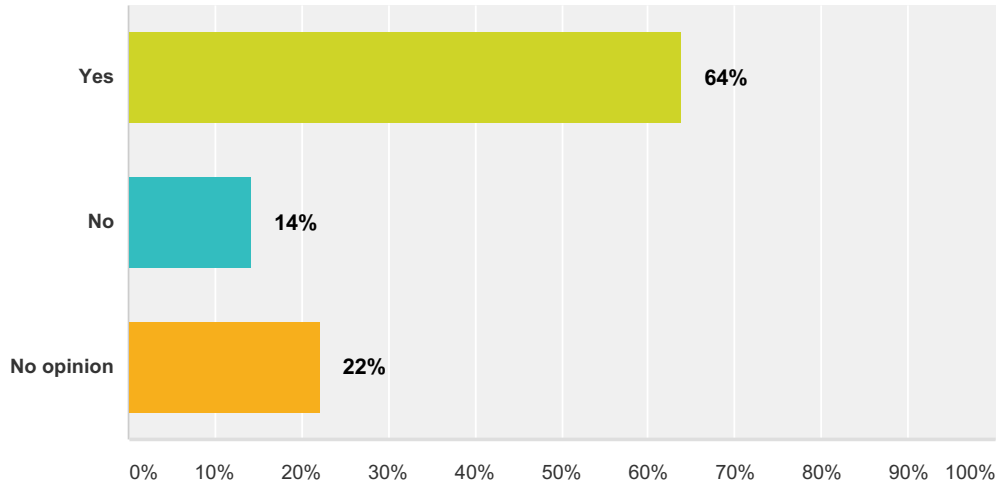

Q33 C20. Leisure and tourism: Would you like the village to provide information about local walks and points of interest at fixed locations in the village?

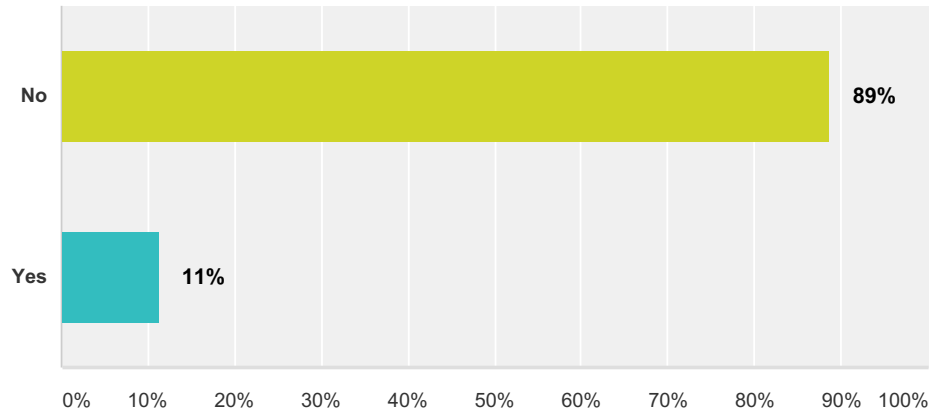

Q34 C21. Housing and planning. Do you have family or friends who would like to live in Swalcliffe, or would you like to move within the village, but cannot find suitable accommodation?

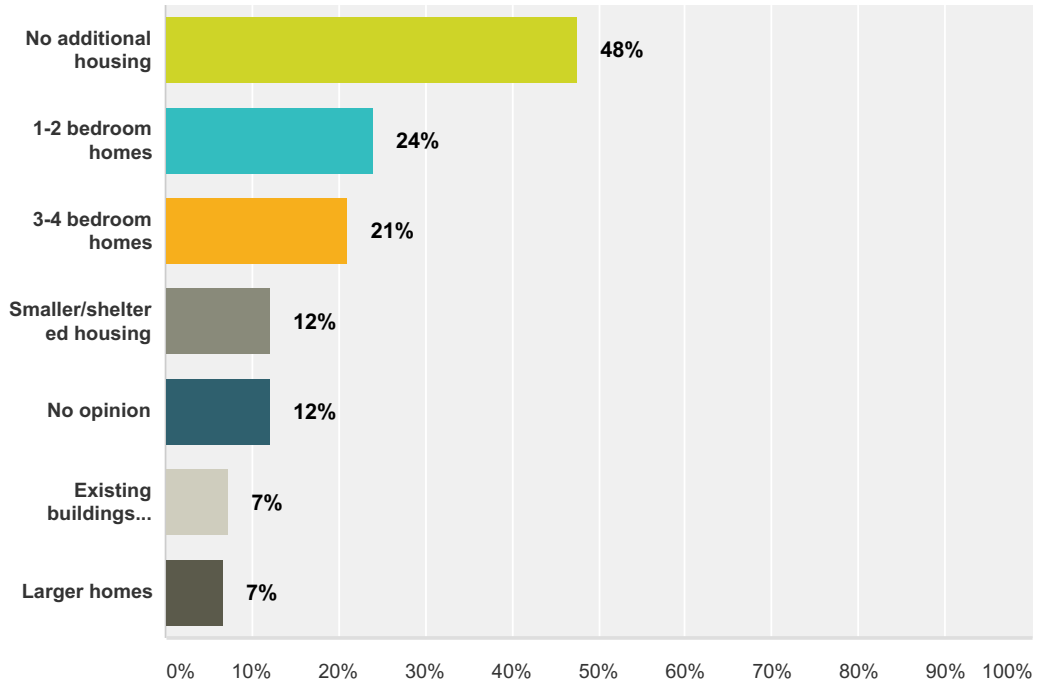

Q35 C22. What size/type of new housing might be appropriate in Swalcliffe? (Please tick all your preferences)

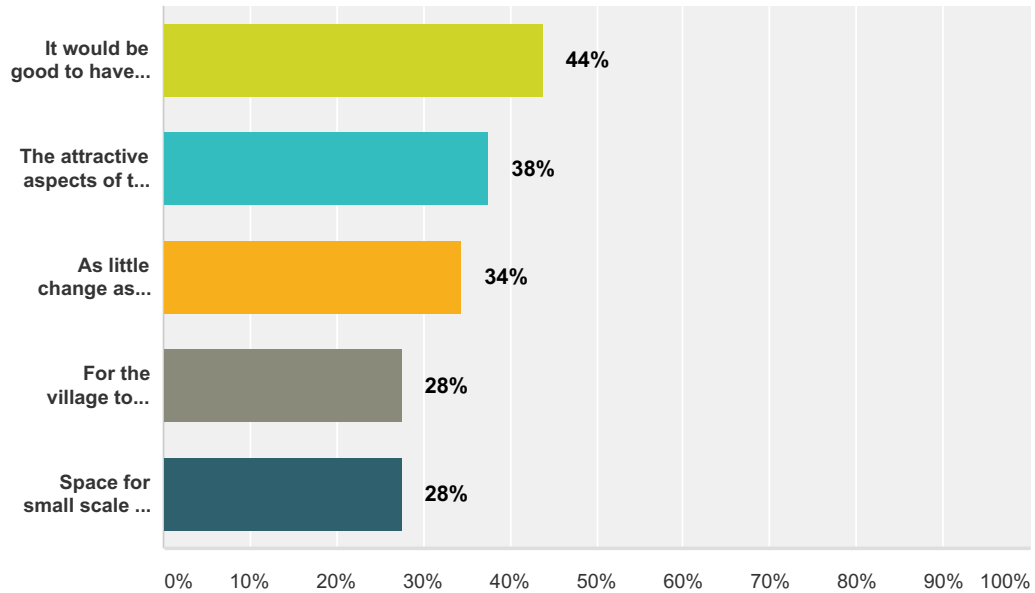

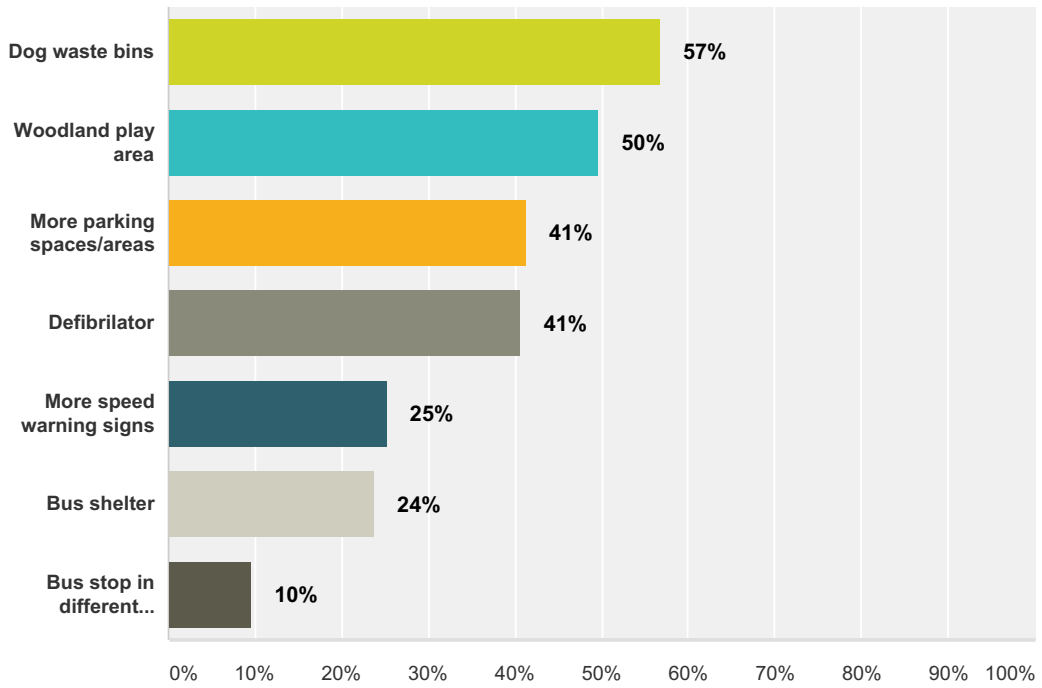

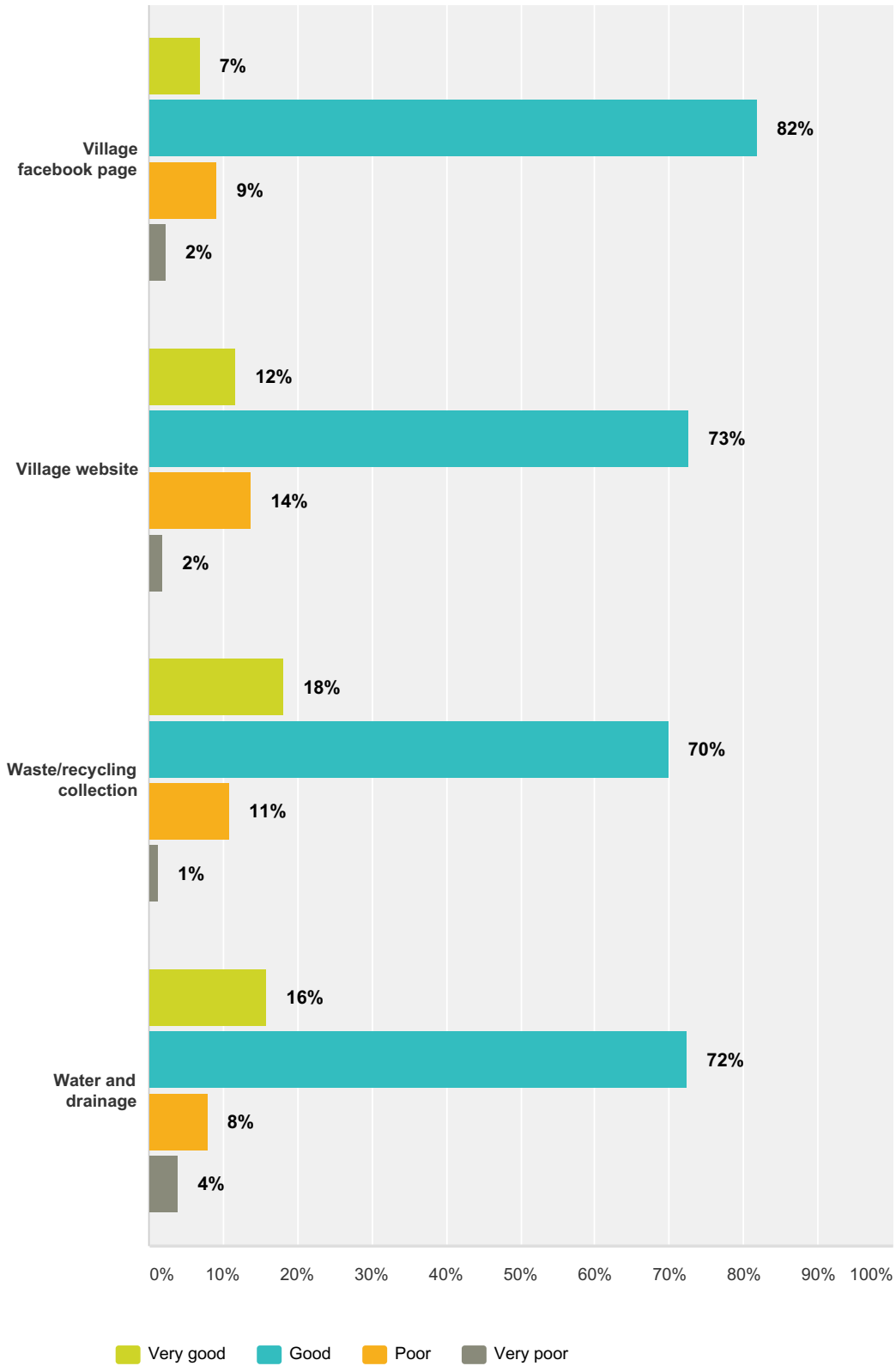
Q38 C25. If there was one thing you would like to see changed in Swalcliffe, what would it be?

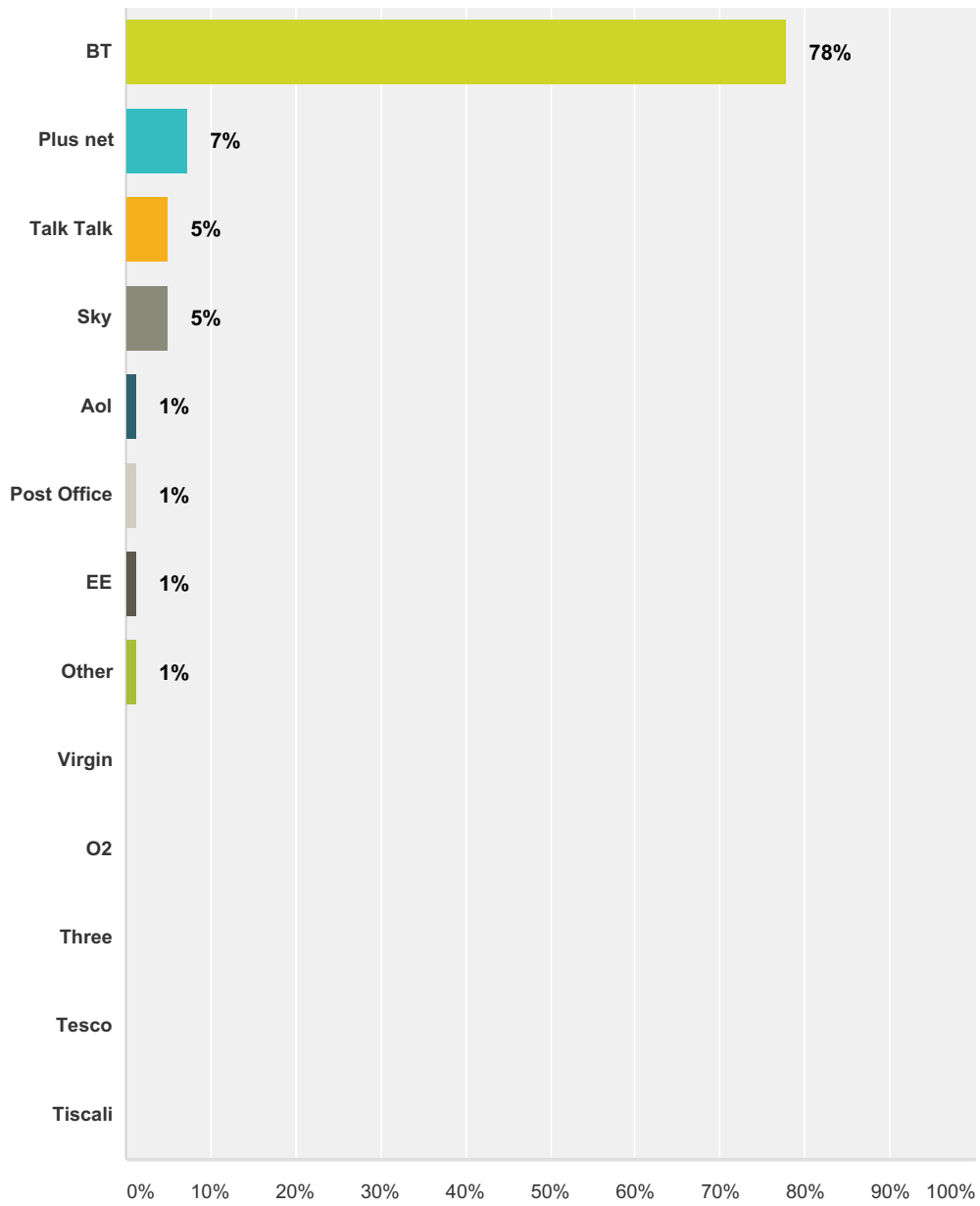

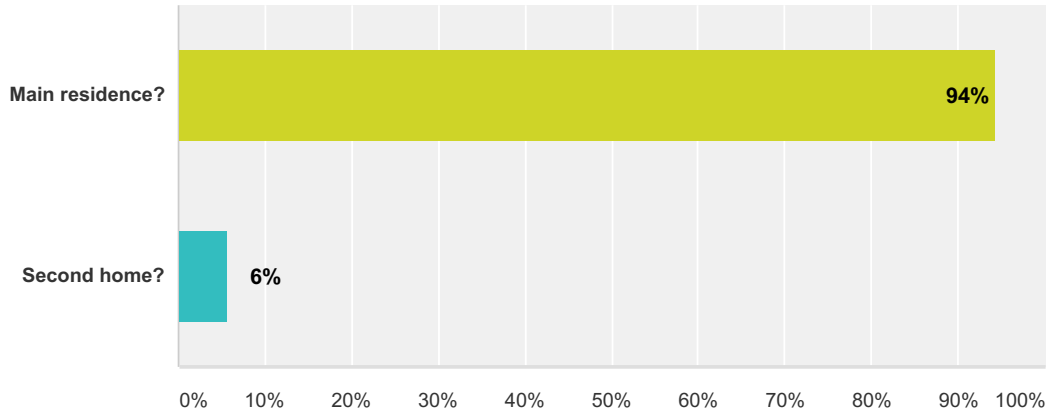

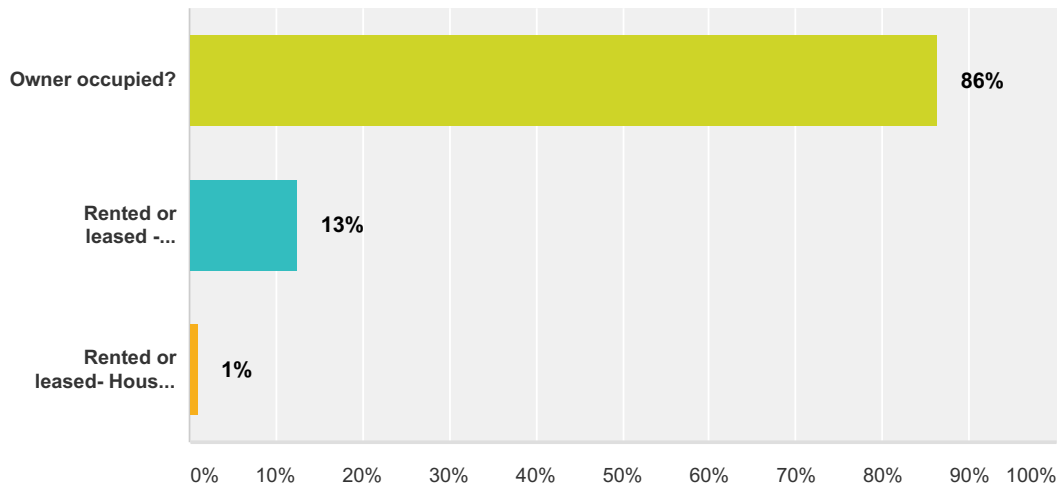

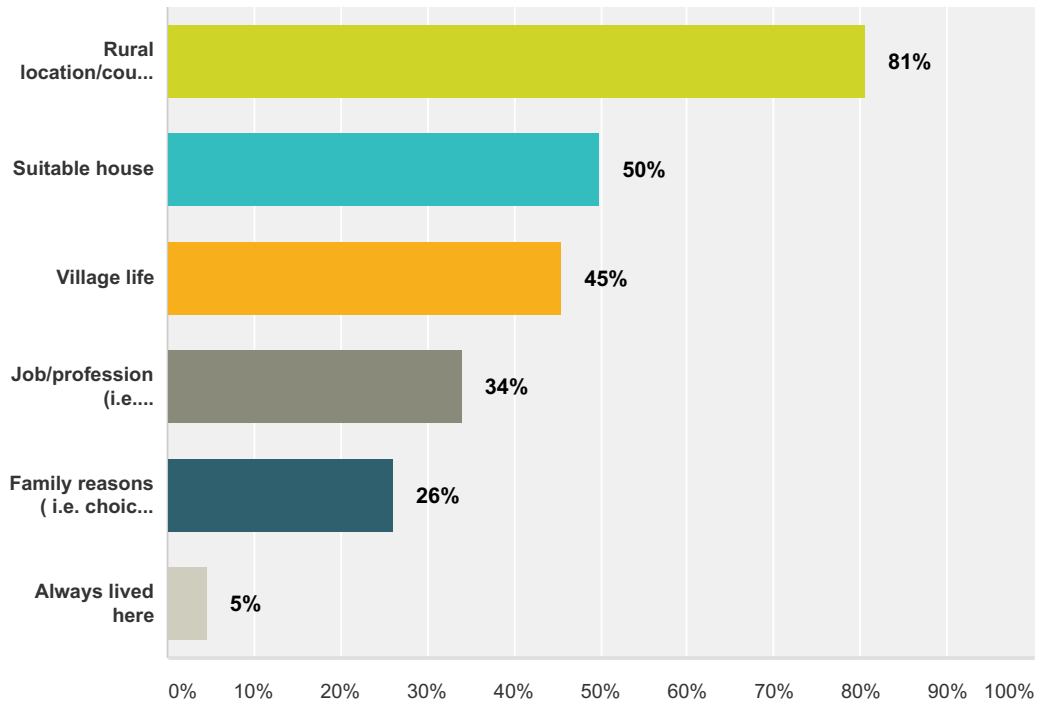
